

































LEAP 2025 is divided by five levels of achievement. Our goal is for every student to reach at least "Mastery" which signals readiness for the next grade level.














Working Together for School Improvement

We are committed to providing families with meaningful, two-way communication about Independence High Magnet and your child's academic progress throughout the year.

Here are ways we can partner to meet our plan's goals:

- <u>Communicate with us</u>: Contact your child's teacher or principal with questions about your child's progress, learning needs, or school events/programs.
- <u>Support learning at home</u>: attend upcoming events to learn more about supporting your child's learning at home.
- The school website is used to let parents know school events and activities

Ways the School Communicates Information to Parents

- <u>Student Progress Center</u>- parents can log into Oncourse Connect to check student's grades, missed assignments, and absences. Also, parents can see any alerts sent regarding the student's progress and behavior.
- <u>Parents Conferences</u> -Every 9 weeks' students receive either progress reports or report cards. Parents
 are invited and encouraged to attend meetings to address curriculum concerns, grade concerns, or
 students' strengths and weaknesses. This event is held throughout the year.
- <u>Progress Report</u>- teachers send home a nine-week progress report
- <u>School Website</u> -parents can check the School Website for information, the teacher's web page, upcoming events, school initiatives, and school board website
- <u>School Messenger</u>-use to inform and remind parents of important school-wide information.
- <u>Orientation</u> -this event is used to inform incoming Grade 7th students and their families about the academic and social expectations of high school.
- <u>Meet and Greet</u> -parents and students are invited to meet their teachers before the first day of school, deliver their supplies, and acclimate themselves to the school and classroom.
- <u>Open House</u>-fall meeting with parents to discuss standards, curriculum, grade level expectations, classrooms routines and procedures, and upcoming events.
